No Point-In-Time Counts were conducted for 2004 and 2006.

\*Unable to combine the information listed below with the Winter 2007 PIT count information. A new procedure was implemented during 2007 wherein surveys were distributed to hotel/motel owners for the purpose of obtaining housing information. The 2007 totals from this survey include results from the count conducted on January 24-25, 2007 which includes: **174 persons (90 adults and 84 children)**.

Other information listed in the Winter 2007 street count survey that could not be included: Living with family (10 single adults, 4 children), staying with friends (7 single adults, 4 children), Jail (2 single adults), Other (6 single adults, 2 children) for a total **35 persons (25 adults and 10 children)**.

The 1st annual 2007 Summer Street count was conducted on August 27, 2007. The count was initiated to accurately count homeless persons living on the street during the summer as well as persons living in emergency and transitional housing only. The total persons counted was **72**. This total includes (19 sheltered-emergency; 16 sheltered-transitional) and 37 Unsheltered persons. The Summer Street count information could not be combined with the winter 2007 PIT survey but was used to document the characteristics and needs of the homeless population in Chesapeake.
